

DESCRIPTION OF KAISER PERMANENTE'S PHYSICIANS AS CLINICAL FACULTY AT UCD

A) Distribution and list of physicians:

Kaiser South has 139 physicians on staff who train the University of California, Davis, School of Medicine residents at the Kaiser South campus:

- 84 Assistant Clinical Professors
- 38 Associate Clinical Professors
- 7 Clinical Professors
- 10 Clinical Instructors

B) A break-down of the various South Sacramento residency affiliations:

EMERGENCY MEDICINE

UC Davis has 36 residents in Emergency Medicine (12 PG1, 12 PG2, and 12 PG3). Kaiser Permanente South Sacramento educates and trains all of them. They rotate 12 residents to Kaiser Permanente South Sacramento per block. The experience is very well-rounded and includes the following rotations:

- Emergency PG1, PG2, PG3
- Orthopedics PG1
- Anesthesiology PG1
- Pediatrics PG2
- Obstetrics PG1
- Ophthalmology PG3
- Otolaryngology PG3

ORTHOPEDIC SURGERY

UC Davis has 20 residents in Orthopedic Surgery. Kaiser Permanente South Sacramento educates and trains all of them. Each PG4 resident rotates in our South Sacramento Orthopedic Surgery Department for 10 weeks.

SURGERY

UC Davis has 45 residents in General Surgery and graduates nine surgeons per year. Kaiser Permanente South Sacramento is a key component of the UC Davis Surgery training program. There are four residents permanently on the South Sacramento Surgery service as follows (rotations allow for Kaiser South Sacramento experience for all residents):

- 1PG5 Vascular Surgery 8 week rotations
- 1PG4 Thoracic, Oncologic, and Endocrine Surgery 8 week rotations
- 1 PG2 General Surgery 8 week rotations
- 1 PG2 General Surgery 8 week rotations

PEDIATRICS

UC Davis has one Pediatric Resident who rotates in Kaiser's Pediatrics Department (PG2 or PG3). They switch every block (changes every month). UC Davis affiliation in pediatrics at South Sacramento allows for experience with Kaiser Permanente's pediatric faculty as follows:

- All residents rotate through Kaiser South Sacramento as PG2 or PG3. Kaiser Permanente's Pediatricians are also actively involved in training all of UCD's Emergency Medicine residents (see above).
- The Allergy Department also educates one of the UC Davis Pediatric Resident (PG1 or PG3) per academic block.
- Kaiser Permanente trains 12 pediatric residents each academic year.

PHYSICAL MEDICINE AND REHABILITATION

UC Davis sends 3 Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation residents to rotate in Kaiser's Occupational Medicine Office (1 PG1 and 6 PG3). The year is divided into eight week blocks. EMG Rotations - Wednesday mornings 8 AM to 12 noon and Occupational Medicine rotations Friday afternoons 1 to 5 PM.

INTERNAL MEDICINE

UC Davis has one Inpatient Internal Medicine (Hospital PG1), seven Continuity Office rotations (PG1 and 6 PG3), plus Ambulatory Rotations (PG1, PG2, PG3) here at Kaiser Permanente South Sacramento. There is an inpatient rotation in Neurology. Continuity Office rotations have a set of residents who rotate in the outpatient setting for the academic year. The residents rotate in various subspecialties as well as primary care clinics. There are also various fellowship rotations in Rheumatology, for example, where fellows spend significant time in their training with our physician staff in the office and in the hospital.

Note: In addition to Kaiser Permanente South Sacramento, Kaiser also trains residents in a variety of specialties in Roseville and Sacramento. In fact, a study of the UCD residencies web site shows how dependent UCD is on Kaiser Permanente for training and research
