All initial EMT-Is are required to have a DOJ Live Scan background check. If you have not resided continuously in California for the past seven (7) years, please check the FBI Level of Service box, too.

**INITIAL EMT-I APPLICANTS
AND
EMT-I APPLICANTS FROM OUT-OF-STATE
WHO WANT A SACRAMENTO COUNTY CERTIFICATION**

- **Initial:** On January 1, 2007, the National Registry began Computer Based Testing throughout California. The nearest CBT site to Sacramento is located in Roseville. If you wish to take a National Registry EMT-B exam you will work with your training program instructor to prepare your application and its supporting documents and with NREMT at www.nremt.org to arrange for payment and examination authorization.
- **Out-of-State:** Contact the NREMT to obtain their NREMT-B card.
- **When you have received your NREMT card and you wish to be certified as an EMT-I in Sacramento County you must complete and submit the following:**
 - Sacramento County EMS Agency EMT-I application
 - Health and Safety Code § 1798.200 affidavit
 - Non-refundable application fee of \$25.00 in cash, check or money order made payable to Sacramento County EMS
 - Current and valid NREMT-B card
 - EMT-I Course Completion record (current within 24 months)
 - Current and valid CPR for the Healthcare Provider card or equivalent
 - Government issued Photo ID
 - DOJ Live Scan Request Form, BCII 8016
 - Please use the SCEMS-specific form on our website
 - If you have not resided continuously in California for the past seven (7) years, please check the FBI Level of Service box, too.
 - You will need to take three copies to the Live Scan location

Sacramento County EMT Recertification

All EMT-Is recertifying from a jurisdiction other than Sacramento County are required to have a DOJ Live Scan background check. If you have not resided continuously in California for the past seven (7) years, You must check the FBI Level of Service box, too.

EMT-I CURRENT OR WITHIN SIX MONTHS

- Sacramento County EMS Agency EMT-I application
- Health and Safety Code § 1798.200 affidavit
- Non-refundable application fee of \$25.00 in cash, check or money order made payable to Sacramento County EMS Agency
- 24 hours of approved EMT-I Refresher Course or 24 Continuing Education Units
- Skills competency verification form, EMSA-SCV (07/03), with original signatures
- Government issued Photo ID
- Current and valid CPR for the Healthcare Provider card or equivalent
- DOJ Live Scan Request Form BCII 8016 if certification is from any jurisdiction than Sacramento County
 - Please use the SCEMS-specific form on our website
 - If you have not resided continuously in California for the past seven (7) years, please check the FBI Level of Service box, too.
 - You will need to take three copies to the Live Scan location
- Current or expired (within 6 months) Sacramento County EMT-I card OR if certified by another California county, that county's card

EMT-I EXPIRED SIX TO TWELVE MONTHS

- All of the above
- Additional 12 Continuing Education Units (total 36)

EMT-I EXPIRED TWELVE TO 24 MONTHS

- All of the above
- Additional 12 Continuing Education Units (total 48)
- Apply for and receive your NREMT-B card

EMT-I EXPIRED over 24 MONTHS

- Retake the EMT-I Basic Course
- Apply for and receive your NREMT-B card
- Request a DOJ Live Scan (and FBI, if required)
- Follow Initial EMT-I process
